Foundation Stage:

This term in PE, pupils in EYFS have begun to use the large climbing frame in the hall. Some of us were very excited about this at the beginning of the term whilst others were a little anxious. In just two weeks most of us have gained in confidence and are now able to climb even higher than our first attempts!

We have also been moving through other stations in the hall during our weekly PE sessions including jumping from a low vault and practising our log rolls.

Key Stage 1:

In Year I this week we have launched our Flat Stanley project. The children have sent their own Flat Stanley characters home ready to go on their very own adventure. We have started to read the original Flat Stanley book by Jeff Brown and are using it as a stimulus to learn all about the world.

This week we have looked at the continents of the world, focussing particularly on Europe. We look forward to seeing Flat Stanley return from the Year I children to find out where in the world he has been.

Lower Key Stage 2:

In Lower Key Stage 2, Year 3 are very excited to have started their swimming lessons at Bourne Pool. Although they have only had two lessons so far, the children have quickly adapted to the routine and we are looking forward to seeing amazing progress over the next two terms.

Upper Key Stage 2:

Year 5 have had a busy two weeks! To launch our study of Christianity in RE, pupils were tasked with building a bridge from limited resources: two pieces of newspaper, four lollipop sticks, a strip of masking tape and only 20 minutes. The built bridge needed to be able to hold an object without collapsing. Working well together in small teams, some fantastic bridges were built and whilst the majority could hold an object, we found most needed stronger foundations and greater support. The message behind the lesson was that Christians believe God created the world exactly as he wanted it, but it was disrupted by Adam and Eve who made a bad choice which brought death and suffering into the world and separated humans from God. God then sent Jesus to act as a bridge between Him and us so that through his teaching and living by example,
