Foundation Stage:

Key Stage I:

In the last two weeks of term, SPCEDS have been busy taking part in the national events including NSPCC's Number Day and Safer Internet Day.

In Year 2, we celebrated Number Day by playing 'Who wants to be a Mathionnaire?', putting each of the children's Maths knowledge to the test in a fun and competitive way. Pupils earned points for answering each question, enjoying the same dramatic music from the show 'Who wants to be a Millionaire?'



Lower Key Stage 2:

In Science, Year Three have been finding out what makes a healthy diet, all about the different food groups and have begun to plan an investigation to find out which is the healthiest breakfast. We now know why it is so important that we eat a healthy breakfast before we come to school!

In English we have loved writing our version of 'The Snowman', a story by Raymond Briggs. We have been focussing on fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and the children have 'wowed' the teachers with their fantastic similes. We even had a shower of real snow on Monday which inspired our writing!

Upper Key Stage 2:

On Friday 7th February, Numbers invaded and took over SPCEDS as we celebrated Number Day to raise money and awareness of the NSPCC. The Maths-themed day saw children come to school dressed in their favourite number clothes (such as 'one'-sies) and take on various different Maths challenges.
