Learning Project - Environment Age Range: Year 5	
<ul> <li>Work on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u>. Have you helped with the Battle of the Bands Y5 v Y6?</li> <li><u>Mathletics</u></li> <li>Show everything you know about shape on a piece of paper. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. Be as creative as you want to be.</li> <li>Select items in your house (this could be rubbish, materials, household objects) and sort them into things that are recyclable and non-recyclable. Remember to select class login.) Answer any questions that are included within the book.</li> <li><u>BBC Reading Lesson</u> – Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief by Rick Riordan.</li> <li><u>Watch</u> and enjoy Rick Riordan talk about the Percy Jackson Series.</li> <li><b>Reading Ramble Challenge</b>: Choose your favourite fiction book and read the first chapter.</li> <li>What do you learn about them in Chapter 1?</li> <li>If you were asked to tell another reader three things about the character, what would they be? Could you 'read between the lines' to find out about their personality or attitude rather than choosing straight-forward stated points?</li> <li>What are the top 3 things people should know about the character?</li> <li>Use what you found out in your Reading Ramble Challenge to create a wanted poster for the character.</li> <li>Reading Comprehension: <u>Plastic Pollution</u></li> <li>Visit <u>authorify</u>. Join the website so that you can access videos, author masterclasses and other activities over the next few weeks.</li> <li><u>David Walliams Elevenses</u>.</li> <li>Create a National Book Token Design <u>Competition</u>.</li> </ul>
Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul> <li>Practise the Year 5/6 Common Exception Words (see list in the Home Learning Pack).</li> <li>Practise your handwriting at the same time by choosing 5 spellings to write out in your best handwriting. Think about using your diagonal and horizontal joins and use <u>the school script</u>.</li> <li>Choose 5 Common Exception words. Write a synonym, an antonym, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Can you use the word in two different sentences?</li> <li>Practise spellings on <u>Spelling Frame</u>.</li> <li>Create a vocabulary bank about the environment and how humans have impacted it e.g. global warming, ozone layer etc. Try to include nouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs and expanded noun phrases.</li> <li><u>Nessy Learning</u> – Use secret word PUZZLINGIGLOO, your name and class to log in.</li> <li>Proofread your writing from the day. You can use a dictionary to check the spelling of any words that you found challenging. This will also enable you to check that the meaning of the word is suitable for the sentence.</li> <li><b>Spelling strategy:</b> Write the words without the vowels and you have to choose the correct grapheme to put in the space. For example, for the word field:</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Writing Task: Wonderful Wizards Talk for Writing – Home Booklet (Two-week project). (A donation has been made to Great Ormond Street Hospital Children's Charity so that you can use this at home for free.)</li> <li>Writing a letter – informal vs formal writing.</li> <li>How do human beings affect the environment? Make notes as you access the information. Write a letter to an influential person who can help save our planet. This could be a world leader, public figure, politician, or anyone else who you believe could make a difference. What points are you going to make based on the information you have read? How could we encourage people to make positive choices about the environment?</li> <li>Using <u>synonyms and antonyms</u> in your writing. Can you change/improve any of the vocabulary you have used in your letter?</li> <li>Mark Grist's <u>Creative Writing Class</u> (every Wednesday)</li> <li><u>Poetry Slam</u> – After watching, have a go at writing your own environment themed poetry.</li> <li>Extra ideas and competitions for writing:</li> <li>Use <u>Pobble 365</u> for inspiration.</li> <li>Into Film review - Write a review of any film you have watched in 100 words of less (win a £20 Amazon voucher).</li> </ul>

## UKS2 Learning Project - to be worked on between Monday 8th June to Friday 19th June

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for you to learn more about the environment. Learning may focus on changes to different environments, the impact of humans on environments, climate change etc.

- **Mrs Mulley's Recycling and Upcycling Challenge.**
- Endangered Species: The tiger, Amur leopard, orangutan, sea turtle and the Sumatran elephant are some of the most endangered animals on the planet. Choose an animal from one region and describe how it has evolved to suit its habitat. Then consider how your chosen animal may need to adapt due to the current environment and human threats it faces. Create an informative leaflet about the threat the animal faces and what humans can do to minimise these threats.
- Upcycling, upcycling: Choose an item within the house that you do not really use anymore this could be an old item of clothing, accessory or household item and upcycle it to make a new item that you will use. When you have finished, evaluate the product and identify any areas that you could improve if you were to make it again. You may even want to write a set of instructions so that other people can upcycle the same item too.
- Protecting our Oceans: Marine life faces a number of threats including plastic pollution, tourism, habitat destruction, ocean warming and overfishing. How can we make a difference now? Sketch an image representing the impact society is having on today's oceans using a drawing material of your choice. Afterwards, you may wish to sketch an image of an ideal ocean environment. Use websites and books to find out what makes the best environment for marine life to flourish (you may wish to research the Great Barrier Reef and its significance).
- Do People Intentionally Damage an Area? Imagine that a new park, housing development, restaurant or other structure is being built on green land near your home. How might this be positive for the environment? How might this be negative for the environment? Create a poster that explains the pros and cons of this new development. Consider wildlife, air and noise pollution and jobs.
- Air Quality Improvement: Air quality has been debated across the globe and many are concerned that pollution is making the quality of air poor in many countries. Create a set of questions that you could ask your parents, grandparents or other family members about how your local area of has changed over time. Afterwards, you could interview your family members and then make a video or written news report about what you have discovered.
