### **Learning Project - Animals**

Age Range: Year 6

### Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- **Work on Times Table Rockstars**
- **Mathletics**
- Show everything you know about decimal numbers and percentages on a piece of paper. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. Be as creative as you want to be.
  - Compare decimal numbers on this game.
- **Daily BBC Maths Lessons** Year 6
- **Deepening Understanding Tasks Year 6**
- Work on your reasoning and problem solving
- Two-handed Maths, Paper, Scissors

Have you ever played 'Rock, Paper, Scissors'? Well this is a maths version of the same game!

#### How to play:

- Stand and facing your partner. Make two fists and say together with your partner 'maths, paper, scissors' whilst moving your fists up and down (in a similar way to when playing rock, paper,
- On scissors, each of you puts out between 0 and 10 fingers.
- You then need to race to multiply the number of fingers you have put out by the number of fingers your partner put out (e.g. 6 x 8), double the answer (e.g. 48 x 2) and call out the answer (e.g. 96).
- The player to call the correct answer first, wins a point.
- Record who wins each 'battle' in a simple table; the first player to 15 points wins!

- Continue to read and enjoy your home reading book. Has anyone recommended any books to you?
- Read chapter six to ten of **Skellig**. This is a book we would have been studying this term.
- Reading Ramble Challenge linked to Skellig.

# UKS2 Learning Project - to be worked on between Monday 18th May to Friday 5th June

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about key animals they are interested in. Learning may focus on exploring the physical aspects of an animal, their habitat, categorising animals etc.

- Mrs Mulley's NHS Challenge
- Animals and their Environment: Describe how animals such as Emperor Penguins, chimpanzees and orcas have adapted to suit their environment. You can do this by writing a short summary after carrying out some research. After this, design a new wondrous animal that has evolved to suit its environment considering the environmental changes it has had to face over recent years.
- Where Animals Originate From: Locate on a world map where different animals originate from and research why they live in these environments. Things for you to consider when researching why they originally lived in these countries are:
  - Food sources

  - Weather
  - Terrain



After doing this, think about how the animals you have selected have adapted so that they are able to live in the UK. Present your findings as a poster or in a PowerPoint presentation.

- Life Cycles: Research a mammal, an insect, an amphibian, a reptile and a bird. Then choose one and draw the life cycle of an animal and label the diagram accordingly. How does the life cycle of the chosen animal differ to a human life cycle?
- Animal Prints: Using a variety of media (this could be materials from around the house such as cloth, newspapers or magazines, felt, etc.), create animal prints for a mammal, an insect, an amphibian, a reptile and a bird of your choice. After, create a collage of the animal prints you have made. You could always use a pencil or pen to sketch the animal prints!
- The Life of Darwin: Who was Charles Darwin? Research the scientist's theory of evolution. Where are the Galapagos Islands? What species did and do still live there? What makes these animals unique and extraordinary? Write a biography about the life of Charles Darwin.
