Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Practise the Year 5/ 6 Common Exception Words (see list in Home Learning Pack).
- Choose 5 Common Exception words. Write a synonym, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence.
- Practise spellings on <u>Spelling Frame</u>.
- Create a vocabulary bank about the area you live in. You may want to use this for some of your writing tasks this week.
- Proofread your writing from the day. You can use a dictionary to check the spelling of any words that you found challenging. This will also enable you to check that the meaning of the word is suitable for the sentence.

Spelling strategy:

Look: first look at the whole word carefully and if there is one part of the word that is difficult, look at that part in more detail.

Say: say the word as you look at it, using different ways of pronouncing it if that will make it more memorable.

Cover: cover the word.

Write: write the word from memory, saying the word as you do so. **Check:** Have you got it right? If yes, try writing it again and again! If not, start again – look, say, cover, write, check.

UKS2 Learning Project - to be worked on between Monday 20th April to Friday 1st May The Area You Live in

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for you to learn more about the area in which you live. Learning may focus on your local area, famous people, key landmarks and links to Spalding.

- **SPCEDS Kindness Challenge**
- An Architectural Masterpiece: Design a new building/structure to inspire the residents of your local town. You must research, plan, design and then make a model of it using materials from around the house. Why would the local council pick your building? What would it offer the community?
- Promoting Your Local Area: A visitor from another country is coming to stay in Spalding for a week. You really need to impress them by showing them the most interesting places in your local area. Where would you take them each day? Plan the itinerary for each day detailing the transport (water taxi etc.) that will be taken to each location, how long will be spent there, what will be eaten and any activities that may take place.
- Where in the World? Show your child how to use Google Earth or Google Maps to look at the geographical features of Spalding, Peterborough and London. How are these places the same? How are these places different? What impacts the similarities and differences? Choose three different places and do the same thing. Do you notice any patterns?
- Places of Worship: The Parish Church of St Mary and St Nicolas is a place of worship in Spalding which Y5 have visited. What other places of worship do you know? Plan an act of worship which could be used. What story would you use? Song? Music? Prayer? Or you might think of another way to celebrate as in our RE lessons Hinduism and Judaism.
- **Draw a picture of your street or house**: Take some time to observe and sketch your street or house. Draw it in anyway you would like. For the street you could try from a <u>one-point perspective</u>.





Graffiti Art: Rachel List's paints praises the NHS, but has graffiti always been seen in a positive light? How have attitudes towards graffiti changed over time? Is all graffiti good? Discuss these questions and then design your own graffiti art using paper and crayons or felt tips. It could be linked to a hobby, interest, the local area or current affairs.
