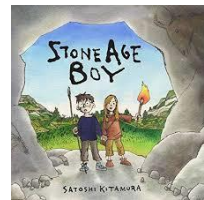




Hello!


