Dear Parent/Carer,



Parish Post Phase Update #proudtobeparish

Foundation Stage:

This week pupils in the Foundation Stage have started our work on 'Ice Planet'. As part of this terms topic we will be encouraging the pupils to think about the cold places in the world. One of our outdoor challenges the children will be able to explore will involve ice and investigating how we can make it melt quicker.

Key Stage 1:

On behalf of the Key Stage One Team I would like to welcome you back to Term 3. It sounds like the children have made some fantastic memories over the Christmas break and I have been really impressed with how focussed they have returned to school. This week has already seen the launch of the new topics in both Year One and Year Two and children have already shown some fantastic progress. We look forward to sharing with you the learning that takes place over the term through our celebration assemblies. Also, please keep an eye on Twitter as we do share examples of work or experiences on there as well.

Lower Key Stage 2:

This week in Lower Key Stage 2 we have been launching our new termly topics. In Year 4 we opened a suitcase full of different objects that were all connected and the children needed to use the clues to work out what it meant. They decided that they were all linked to countries in Europe. We then shared our pre-existing knowledge of Europe through a Flat Chat activity which allowed the children to discuss, build upon or politely correct knowledge other children had written down. The children then had the opportunity to think about and identify a range of questions that they would like to find out about Europe as we progress through this term's topic.

Upper Key Stage 2:

This week in Year 6, we have continued our work based on the First World War. The pupils have used their prior learning from before Christmas about life in the trenches. They have then used the vocabulary they gathered to plan their own short narratives set in World War I. To support their learning we have explored a story about two child soldiers, Jack and George, who went to fight in France to identify the features of a short historical narrative. As part of their learning the pupils are now going to write their own short narratives based on this stimulus and they are all very excited and can't wait to share their final versions!
