Car Parking

Information and Guidance from the Lincolnshire Education Team

During the Christmas break, we received an email from the Lincolnshire Education Team sharing information from the NHS Federated Urgent Care Team. They have asked that we help to emphasise the importance of parents/carers choosing the right pathway when a child becomes ill and options available when their child needs treatment.



"We are asking for your support, along with our GP colleagues and nursery providers in the County, to help spread the attached message. Each year A&E sees a large number of families and children that present with minor symptoms and/or respiratory tract in fections. The guide below should help families get to see the right person in the right place for the right symptoms."

Self-care	Grazed Knee Cough or cold Sore throat	Make sure your medicine cupboard is stocked up with over the counter remedies
NHS 111	Unsure Unwell Confused Need to know where to go	When you need medical help fast but it's not a 999 emergency
Pharmacy	Diarrhoea Runny Nose Headache	For advice on common illnesses and medicines to treat them
Your GP and Out of Hours	Ear pain Backache Throat infection	If you have an illness or injury that won't go away make an appointment to see your GP. If it's outside your GP's opening hours, you can telephone your GP surgery to be directed to the local 'Out of Hours' service.

Start and End of Day Routines

Whilst there are staff around at these times, they do have a class responsibility and will be very focussed on welcoming children at the start of the day and ensuring all pupils are handed over to parents at the end of the day. If I could also ask you to keep all children, including school age and pre-school children, off the school equipment at the beginning at the end of the school day. Such equipment has restrictions in terms of numbers of children and weight and as such use should be supervised. As a school we feel it is very important to provide resources for the children to use within school and have worked hard to fundraise in order to be able to finance such resources. However such items are very expensive and do therefore need to be respected and looked after to ensure longevity. Thank you for your support in this matter.
