

Foundation Stage:

We enjoyed wearing odd socks to school to raise awareness of the fact that it is ok and good to be different. This week we celebrated Anti-Bullying Week. We spoke about how we should always be kind to others and we thought of the kind things we had done. Examples talked about included holding doors open for people, sharing toys and resources, lending things to our friends and saying nice things to others. We then listened to a story called 'Giraffes Can't Dance!' It's about a giraffe who likes to dance but isn't very good at it. By the end of the story, his friends support him to dance and he enjoys it, realising it is good to be different.

Key Stage I:

On Wednesday this week, Year 2 pupils visited Lincoln Castle. We took part in some fantastic activities where we brought our classroom learning to life. We took part in a Castle Wall walk where we walked around the very top of the castle walls, learning all about the history that had taken place there over the years. The pupils also made their own shields and learnt all about the life of a knight, including their armour and also shooting a wooden bow and arrow! Our day finished with a fantastic banquet, where we took on the roles of the king, queen and even provided our own entertainment!



Lower Key Stage 2:

Year 4 en joyed a visit from History Off The Page to learn about life in the Anglo-Saxon and Viking days. We were transported back to a Viking village in 878 A.D. In the morning we tried our hand at traditional Viking jobs: illuminating letters, weaving doth, making clay pots and making Beeswax candles. We also learnt about the clothes Vikings wore and why they wore them, as well as asking lots of questions about them.

In the afternoon we became archaeologists, digging for artefacts. We thought about what they were made of and their use and used the clues to work out which part of the Viking village they came from.

Upper Key Stage 2:

On Friday 8th November, Year 6 were lucky enough to visit the 'Installation for the Fallen' at the Parish Church St Mary and St Nicolas to learn more about local soldiers who fought in World War I. During the visit the children were able to enter St George's Chapel to view a memorial to the 263 men from the Spalding District, who lost their lives during the First World War. Year 6 were joined by Reverend John Bennett who led a special Remembrance service. The children also had the opportunity to visit the Taku Bridge which was decorated for the occasion in knitted poppies by local knitters from Spalding.
