

### Foundation Stage:

In readiness for Guy Fawkes Night celebrations earlier this week we had a visit by two firemen from Spalding Fire Station who talked to us about how to stay safe when near fireworks and sparklers. We learnt how to 'Stop, Drop and Roll' if our clothes caught fire and how to wear gloves when handling sparklers.

We have also been learning about the days of the week in our Maths sessions alongside learning about the number seven. In Phonics we are learning these sounds: j', v', w', x', y' and z'.

### Key Stage 1:

This week the whole school enjoyed watching 'The Boy Who Cried Wolf' by the theatre company 'Tutti Frutti'. Year I were lucky enough to spend some time talking to the cast afterwards learning about the different musical instruments that they used. We are looking forward to using this as a stimulus for our writing in the coming weeks.

## Lower Key Stage 2:

# Upper Key Stage 2:
