Foundation Stage:

This week has seen the launch of our 'Wiggle, Wriggle, Jiggle' work on mini beasts and the exciting and interactive workshop. We got to meet and touch many animals including




a python snake, a chameleon, large spider, two tortoises and a skunk. Children have been sharing their experiences and learning about animals through several medium, including art with some beautiful hedgehogs created using autumn leaves.



Key Stage 1:

The children in Year I started their addition and subtraction learning this week by Looking at 'wholes' and 'parts of wholes'.







They have then used the part, part, whole model to show this using concrete objects, pictures and then by using numbers.

Our next step will be to use these to work out addition and subtraction calculations and number bonds to 10.

Lower Key Stage 2:



Year 4 are starting to look at the story of 'A Small Miracle'. We started off looking at some images from the story to predict what we thought would happen. We will have to wait and see if any of our predictions were correct! We will now look at the book, and the film version of the story and write the narrative to go with the images. We look forward to sharing our finished work soon.

Upper Key Stage 2:

The Autumn Term has seen the introduction of our Year 6 Poetry Club. Our first exciting event was to prepare a poem for the 'Poppy Princess' competition. They were given the task to write a poem depicting Poppies in 8 lines. They worked brilliantly and independently to produce a range of thoughtful and powerful poems on the theme. They worked hard in their free time to plan, write, publish and practise reading their poems ready for the event at St Johns Church on Saturday 12th October. The school were very proud of the girls, who went on to take part in the competition.

They read their poems confidently and fluently to the panel of judges and in front of their families and friends, who had come to support.
