
Foundation Stage:

This week we have all planted our own bean seeds and are busy looking after them. We have been writing short instructions about how to plant a seed and we all now know what seeds need to grow. We are very excited to see how tall they grow! When thinking about words for our instructions, we heard many known and unknown sounds and then tried to use our sound mats to help us write them down.



In Maths this week we have been representing numbers in different ways and have used tens frames, Numicon and bead strings to move our learning on. We have also been enjoying using number stories to help us.

Key Stage I:



We have had the most amazing week in Key Stage One! It has been an absolute pleasure to visit different classrooms and see first hand the learning journeys of the children. It was also an opportunity to thank them all for all their hard work. Year One have recently started their learning all about Mr Grinling who has had to deal with some pesky seagulls in 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'.

In Year 2 we have also said goodbye to our fluffy little chicks who had already developed feathered wings and tail feathers! We are hoping that 'The Happy Chick Company' will send us some regular updates which we will be able to share with you all.

Lower Key Stage 2:

We have had such a lovely week in Year 4! We have continued our learning journey about the Mayans using the text 'From Bean to Bar' in English. This informative text has taught us all about how chocolate is made and we will be using the text and the structure a stimulus to help us write our own explanation texts.



In Maths, we are continuing to work hard on decimals and using our knowledge of fractions to consolidate our learning. In Science our topic is 'Disgusting Digestion', last week our experiment showed us the effect that different drinks have on our teeth. This week we will be undertaking another practical investigation where we will be using household items to show the process of digestion from start to finish!

Upper Key Stage 2

With one week left of this term, time is flying by! We've en joyed taking advantage of the outdoors as the sun shines a little brighter and a little longer. Speaking of which, if you have any questions about the Sun, or any other celestial body in the Solar System, feel free to ask someone in Year 5. Next week, Year 5 will be looking back at the past 5-6 weeks and reflecting on all they've learned about space. As one keen astronomer said this past Monday, "We're actually in space! Right now!"

Elsewhere, we continue to use our voices to explore thoughts and analyse new information. With a real emphasis on oracy recently, we've encouraged children to put more of their thoughts into words, before transferring to paper. This has led to fantastic discussions and prompted questions and queries, both enlightening and confusing us! After all, 'True knowledge exists in knowing that you know nothing' (Socrates).
