COVID-19

A huge thank you to all of our parents for continuing to follow the social distancing guidance at the start and end of the day, it is very much appreciated. Whilst we are beginning to see a gradual release from the recent restrictions, it is clear that there are still cases locally and as such we all still need to remain vigilant to ensure the safety of all. The current DfE guidance is still to remain cautious with the release of safety measures currently in place within schools and as such we will continue with our current guidance into Term 6. Once we return after the term break please do not send your child to school if they are displaying any of the following symptoms:

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The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- ✓ New continuous cough and/or
- ✓ High temperature and/or
- ✓ A loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness.

If your child does develop symptoms, you can seek advice from the NHS.UK website at https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/check-if-you-have-coronavirus-symptoms/. If you are concerned about your child's symptoms, or they are worsening you can seek advice from NHS III at https://III.nhs.uk/ or by phoning III. You must also stay at home and not go out for any reason if you are told to self-isolate be it by the school or Track and Trace.

How to stop COVID-19 spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19.

Do:

- ✓ Wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- ✓ Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- ✓ Wash your hands as soon as you get home
- ✓ Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- ✓ Put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards

Reporting a Positive Case during the Term Break

As always a huge thank you to all of you for your continued support throughout the current pandemic. Your support in adhering to the guidance in place has been and will continue to be essential for us to be able to continue to keep the school safe and open in such challenging times.

As you will be aware it may still be the case that members of the school community do test positive for COVID 19 during the closure period. Please can I ask you to read the details below and store this letter in case you need it during the holiday period. Where pupils have tested positive for COVID 19 and developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, schools have been asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the child may have been infectious whilst in school. The Trust are always notified of a positive case and, as such, will be the first port of call for reporting a positive case during the holiday period.

Please do not phone the school as phone lines will not be monitored.

Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, so from 31^{st} May onwards as per the table above, the school or Trust should not be contacted. However, parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

To reassure parents the above email address will be monitored throughout the term break and we will take action if we are advised of a positive test in the school community. We will continue to use Wisepay to inform parents of any updates that may affect them over this period of time

Online Safety

Our work around e-Safety and particularly social media continued during Term 5, following our whole school support of Internet Safety Day earlier in the academic year. As part of this work Year 6 undertook some workshops about online safety earlier this week with Dan Hawbrook from the Local Authority. Whilst we continue to develop the use of technology following the recent restricted provision and the shift to blended learning, we will continue to promote online safety so we can ensure the pupils know how to keep themselves safe in all scenarios.

May I also take this opportunity to remind everyone that, as a school, we continue to work hard to teach the children how to use social media both responsibly and respectfully. Your support in demonstrating this to your child is greatly appreciated. Should you have any concerns please do not hesitate to come in to school to discuss them.

Parking

Please remember to park courteously for the safety of all our community whilst respecting our neighbours. Please park legally allowing the safe use of the road and pavements for all. Do not park on the public footpath as it makes it dangerous with the numbers of people using them. If you are just dropping your child off, please park up and ensure their safe exit from the vehicle on to the pavement.

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Children should then be able to walk safely into school. The closer to school you get the more congested it is so if you are able to park further away or even walk all the way to and from school this would be appreciated, particularly given the promise of improved weather ahead. We have had a number of complaints from local neighbours in recent weeks where driveways were blocked as a result of parking. We are all a community and it is important that we work together for the benefit of all. If you could please bear our neighbours in mind when parking, this would be very much appreciated.

Sun Safety

As we have seen the arrival of the sunshine and warmer weather towards the end of Term 5, could we please ask that you send your child into school prepared for the weather. If you could please ensure your child has a hat to keep the sun off their head during the times of the day when they are outside and a drinks bottle in school each day filled with fresh water to ensure your child stays hydrated in the warmer weather.

And finally, let's pause for thought...

Imagine there is a bank account that credits your account each morning with £86,400. It carries over no balance from day to day. Every evening the bank deletes whatever part of the balance you failed to use during the day. What would you do? Draw out every penny, of course? Each of us has such a bank. Its name is TIME.
