Foundation Stage:

It has been another great week in FS2 with one of the highlights being Number Day that we really en joyed celebrating on Friday 7th May aimed at raising money for the NSPCC. As part of our activities for the day we looked at the numbers each other were wearing. Some of us had created Numberblocks to wear and one child had made a 100 jumper. We read a number story together called 'Ten Little Dinosaurs' and thought about what was the same and what was different using the ten dinosaur images. We joined in with the repeated parts of the story and especially liked joining in with the roaring sounds! We have also been developing our vocabulary in other ways in FS2 and our word of the week has been 'exhilarating.' What an exhilarating week!

Key Stage I:



We have had another fabulous week in Key Stage I with lots of learning, even though it was a shorter week. During the week Year 2 have been preparing for a very 'eggciting' event happening in school next week!

On Monday 10th May we see the arrival of a special delivery in Year 2 as we

learn all about life cycles! 'The Happy Chick Company' will deliver 18 eggs to school along with everything needed for us to help our little chicks hatch. It will be our job to document their journey from egg to chick and look after our new class members. Lower Key Stage 2:

This week Year 4 have taken on the role of 'newspaper reporters' writing and publishing their own newspaper reports on the incredible Pok-A-Tok match in 'The Rain Player' story. All of the children have really enjoyed the opportunity to act as both journalists, editors and publishers.

In Science we have been looking at digestion and discovering what happens to our food when we eat it and the journey it goes on as it travels through our bodies. We have also been revising both multiplication and division as part of our Maths learning. This has included using written methods in our calculations.



Upper Key Stage 2:

We have reached the half way point of Term 5 and what a journey it has been so far - it really has been 'Out of this World!' We have continued our exploration of outer space and investigated the distance from the sun of each planet by creating our own solar system on the field. We have also looked at the temperature of each planet. Did you know that even though Neptune is the furthest away, Uranus is actually the coldest planet?

In addition to our work in Space, we have started our exploration of Salvation in RE. We have been finding our inner detectives to answer the question: *Why do Christians believe in the resurrection?* This has meant using the Easter story in the Bible to find evidence and reasoning for why Easter is celebrated as well as researching how Christians show their faith around the same time of year.
