# Read all about it...




A huge welcome back to you all, both to families already part of the Spalding Parish family but also to the new children and families we have welcomed over the term so far. it has been brilliant to

meet you and to have you as part of the Spalding Parish family. I look forward to getting to know you all over the year ahead.

We have also welcomed a number of new members of staff to the Spalding Parish family. Charlotte Hardy joins us as our new Assistant Head and SENCo, Gemma Brown joins us as our new PE and Sports Apprentice and we welcome Rebecca Street, Manisha Mistry and Natalie Quigg as lunchtime supervisors.

We also welcome Jasmin Turner and Jennifer Woodiwiss who are completing their teacher training at Spalding Parish over the course of the 2022-23 academic year. They are working in Y1CH and Y3EP so any parents/carers of pupils in these classes may meet them over the year as we involve them in school activities, including Parent Consultations, as part of their training.



#### **Crossing Patrol Warden/Parking**

As I am sure you will have noticed the vacancy for the Crossing Patrol Warden, following Sam Williams leaving, has not yet been filled. We are hoping that this will be filled in the very near future and I have been in touch with Lincolnshire County Council regarding the urgency of this, particularly given concerns raised about parking around the school site over the first two weeks of term.

Parking on the yellow lines, either straight or zig zag, is a traffic offence and traffic signs are obvious outside school reinforcing this. As such, should you park here you may be asked by staff to move on. This is nothing personal, merely the actions of a committed staff team trying to ensure the safety of all. Pupils and families cannot cross safely if cars are causing an obstruction.

Similarly the school car parks are only for use by school staff and by companies employed by Lincolnshire School Transport to drop pupils at school including local taxi companies. I do appreciate it may not seem a problem to park in the car park to drop your child, however this may mean a member of staff cannot get parked which could then impact on the start of the school day. Traffic in the car parks can also be free flowing at times meaning this is not a safe place for pupils to be dropped off.

Whilst I fully acknowledge that it is extremely busy at the beginning and the end of the school day around the school site, I would urge that you continue to be considerate to our school community, and to the local residents, and not park in inappropriate places, obstruct roads or in the staff car parks. Also, please do not park on the public footpaths as it makes it dangerous with the numbers of people using them. Please park legally allowing the safe use of the road and pavements for all.

Please, if necessary, park just a little bit further away and walk the last part of the journey as this will help to ensure that all members of our school community get to school safely. Thank you in anticipation of your support.



### **Responding to Concerns**

At the start of the school year our focus has very clearly been on getting all of our pupils and school community back to school and ready for the year ahead. I would like to thank you all for your support with this over the last couple of weeks.

It is always a little challenging settling into new routines on the return to school in September. As a parent myself I do appreciate how hard it is to manage bringing up children and running a home, without added complexities such as being a working parent, or caring for other family members. As such we do really appreciate your support in getting the children to school each day.

We also know that frustrations can run high at this time of the year both for adults and for children for a whole range of reasons. If you do have any worries, or if there is something you need to share as it may impact your child's day then please speak to your child's class teacher. Similarly members of the SLT are available on the site each morning and afternoon for parents/carers to speak to or emails can be sent to feedback@spaldingparish.laat.co.uk.

In line with our Adult Code of Conduct please remember it is not appropriate for parents to be using abusive language towards or repeatedly challenging another parent, pupils in school or members of staff. This will not be tolerated either within or outside of the school community, particularly given the fact that the primary aim of all staff at SPCEDS is caring for and ensuring the safety of your child. Such incidents will be taken extremely seriously and may, in some instances, lead to a ban from the school site. I'm sure you will agree that only by working together can we ensure a safe, positive and happy environment for all our pupils.



#### **Playground Equipment**

It has been fabulous to see families on the school site over the course of the last two weeks and also to chat to so many of you. I look forward to this continuing over the year ahead - as stated previously we are here to help.

With that in mind I also need to ask for your help and support at the beginning and end of the school day. You will be aware that we do have fixed play equipment on both the KS1 and KS2 playgrounds. This is for use by the appropriately aged children during the course of the school day when there is appropriate supervision in place. As such we ask that pupils or pre school children refrain from using at the beginning or end of the school day. This will allow us to ensure that the equipment is safe to use during the day and also ensure that the equipment is being used by the appropriately aged children. As I'm sure you'll appreciate inappropriate use can lead to accidents. Thank you in anticipation, we do appreciate your support in ensuring the safety of all. Staff will be monitoring this moving forwards and will be speaking to parents/carers where there are concerns.

Similarly the site is closed each afternoon between 3.25pm and 3.30pm so if you could please ensure you are leaving the school site promptly at the end of the school day. This is necessary due to our safeguarding procedures as the gates need to be locked before any of our after school clubs, including Parish Pioneers, can use the outdoor space. Again we thank you for your support with this matter.



#### **School Lunches**

#### **Hot Lunches**

As you will know the school kitchen falls under school governance. As a result, nutritious well balanced school meals are freshly cooked each day in our own kitchen. As part of this we have been closely working with the Lincolnshire Food in Schools team to ensure hot meals produced for the children are healthy and meet statutory guidance. As such children have a daily choice of:

- A hot meal
- A vegetarian option
- A jacket potato with filling
- A school-made packed lunch (KS2 Years 3-6 only)

The meals provided by the school kitchen team are very popular and I know the ladies in the kitchen have been keenly developing this provision, providing meals that the children enjoy but that are also healthy and nutritionally sound. Given the Government initiative of Universal Infant Free School Meals, these meals are free to all pupils in Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2.

#### **Packed Lunches**

You may choose to provide your child with a healthy packed lunch (an example of this is given below):

• Sandwich (can be replaced with another savoury item, for example a wrap)

Please note this should not be replaced with a sweet alternative

- Savoury snack such as crackers or crisps
- Fruit
- A sweet snack such as a cereal/biscuit bar

#### Nuts: VERY IMPORTANT: SPCEDS is a 'nut-free' zone

Please note that we cannot allow nuts in school either as a snack, in snack bars or as peanut butter in sandwiches due to the risk of anaphylaxis. This also includes any food item where nuts may be present in chocolate spreads and fillings such as Nutella. Even the dust from peanuts can be fatal and it is imperative that parents/carers adhere to this very important regulation.



#### **School Office**

For parents/carers information the office opening hours are as follows:

Monday: 8am to 4pm

Tuesday: 8am to 4pm

Wednesday: 8am to 4pm

Thursday: 8am to 4pm

Friday: 8am to 3.30pm

Whilst we do endeavour to keep the office manned during these times, there are times over the course of the school day when staff need to pop out of the office, e.g. to take late children to the classroom or collect children where there may be medical appointments.

Where this is the case, this is often only for a matter of minutes so we really do appreciate your support and patience if no one is available. On very rare occasions, the answer machine may be used so important messages are not missed. Again this is likely to only be for a short period so if you do need to speak to someone regarding your query and the answer machine is on, we would advise trying again. Thank you in anticipation of your continued support.




### Website

### Curriculum Corner




#### **Welcome Back**



# General Updates (for start of year)



#### **COVID-19 Guidance**

Whilst we are hopefully looking forward to an uninterrupted school year, it is clear that COVID-19 remains with us. However, the current guidance remains very much the same as it was prior to the summer break. If you do have any questions around this please do not hesitate to get in touch.

From 1st April 2022 the guidance around COVID and testing has been amended, as was previously outlined on the COVID road map and our transition into 'Living with COVID'.

Covid is now specifically referenced in the guidance around the control of infectious diseases and there is no separate COVID guidance. Section 3 is related to management of infectious diseases, COVID being detailed within the section about Respiratory Infections. Section 4 of this guidance references actions to be taken should there be an 'outbreak'. For ease, the link to the document is below with the guidance being as follows.

Essentially – COVID will be treated as we would any other infectious illness. Staff and children will be encouraged to stay at home if they are unwell. Where there is a positive COVID test, the timescales as below are advised:

• 5 days for staff and 3 days for pupils.

Further to the above, children/staff with a temperature, should not return to school/work whilst they still have a temperature, but can return with mild cold symptoms and if they are otherwise well enough to be at school/work.

#### Start and End of Day Routines - Reminder

Thank you for your support in ensuring pupils are at school on time, it is very much appreciated and does ensure pupils are ready for the start of the day. There does seem to have been some confusion around timings for the beginning and end of day which are as follows:

FS2: Start of Day 8.50am (doors open from 8.40am)		End of Day 3.10pm
KS1 (Year 1 - 2):	Start of Day 8.50am (doors open from 8.40am)	End of Day 3.10pm
KS2 (Year 3 - 6):	Start of Day 8.45am (doors open from 8.35am)	End of Day 3.20pm

In a morning the gates will open at 8.30am on a morning to allow time to get onto site ready for doors opening at 8.35am (KS2) and close at 8.55am.

Similarly, on an afternoon, the gates at the end of the day will open at 3.05pm ready for end of day at 3.10pm (KS1) and close at 3.30pm.

These timings do need to be adhered to at the beginning and end of day to ensure our safeguarding requirements are met so we would appreciate your support with this. If you do have any concerns, please speak to a member of the Senior Leadership Team.

When on the site please be courteous and stand away from the classroom windows and doors as pupils will still be learning until the end of the school day.

If we could also please ask that school equipment, including the gym equipment on the playgrounds, is not used at the beginning or end of the day. We appreciate that this is very tempting but use needs to be supervised by school adults so if you could please ensure your children do not use. This will ensure that pupils and families are able to stay safe.

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#### Attendance - a further reminder

As we continue the return towards normality, attendance continues to be closely monitored, particularly given current absences.

Please remember if your child is unwell and unable to attend school, you should inform school by 9.30am that day in line with our school procedures. Please contact school on each day of absence unless otherwise agreed.

Also please remember that routine dental and medical appointments should not be made during school time. It is preferable and much more beneficial for pupils if appointments can be made either at the end of the school day or during school holidays. If you do have to make an appointment for during the school day, and we do appreciate that there are times when this may be necessary, please bring the appointment letter to the school office. Without this letter the absence will not be authorised.

We are also seeing an increase in leave of absence requests. Current Government regulations mean that absence from school can only be authorised for "exceptional circumstances" for which there is very clear established criteria, again set by the Government. It is therefore highly unlikely that time off school will be authorised during term time.

Requests for term time absence, for any reason, must be made at least 10 days before the absence, except in emergencies, by booking an appointment with a member of the Senior Leadership Team.

Should an appointment not be made, and in line with our safeguarding procedures and Government regulations, we will contact you with regards to your child's absence in order to clarify fully the reasons for absence.

Your child's education is our primary focus and given the extensive research proving a direct link between good attendance and good outcomes, alongside the national attendance guidance for schools, we do follow all absences up. This is not about singling anybody out but simply carrying out our statutory duty as a school and as such I would ask for your support in communicating with us in a positive way. Thank you in anticipation of your continued support.



### Safeguarding

Safeguarding is an important part of our work with children and young adults so we will keep this reminder in each edition of the Parish Post. Safeguarding is the responsibility of all of us.

If you have concerns about the safety of any child, please let somebody know.




#### **Local Council**

I am sure that the children will have lots of inspiration through school activities to include in their writing this year and will also continue to develop their own love of reading and story writing.





# Phase Learning Journeys




### **Key Stage 1**

We're starting in Year 2 this year to hear all about their learning over the last fortnight.

### Year 2

### **Lower Key Stage 2**


We're starting with Year 4 in focus this week.

### Year 4

Year 4 have had a fantastic start to the academic year and have all settled in really well. The children have all been impressing the Year 4 adults with their place value knowledge. They have also been working hard on recalling their three times tables.

As part of our History learning the children are learning about what life was like in Britain during the Anglo Saxon times. As part of this we have started identifying difference and similarities between the kingdoms in Anglo Saxon times compared to how the country is divided today. This also links to our class story 'Anglo Saxon Boy'.

In Science the pupils have started to learn about the digestive system and the journey food takes through their bodies. We are looking forward to a fun Science experiment next week so watch this space! What a busy but exciting start to Year 4!




### **Upper Key Stage 2**


Year 6's learning is the focus of the Parish Post this week.

#### Year 6

What a start to Year 6 we have had! The team are so proud of the children as they are taking the new challenges of Year 6 in their stride and impressing us with their attitude to learning. We are proving to be expert mathematicians especially with place value and numbers to 10,000,000. Top tips are helping us to dig deeper with our understanding and explaining to others. 'I do', 'We do' and 'You do' have enabled some great anchor charts to be developed on the Learning Walls, which can then be used as scaffolds and prompts in our independent learning.




As Historians, we have been investigating sources from WW1 Tommy Soldiers to identify them. We couldn't believe the number of child soldiers that fought in WW1 with the youngest being 12 years old.
