General Updates



COVID Update

From 1st April 2022 the guidance around COVID and testing has been amended, as was previously outlined on the COVID road map and our transition into 'Living with COVID'.

Covid is now specifically referenced in the guidance around the control of infectious diseases and there is no separate COVID guidance. Section 3 is related to management of infectious diseases, COVID being detailed within the section about Respiratory Infections. Section 4 of this guidance references actions to be taken should there be an 'outbreak'.

Essentially – COVID will be treated as we would any other infectious illness. Staff and children will be encouraged to stay at home if they are unwell. Where there is a positive COVID test, the timescales as below are advised:

- 5 days for staff and
- 3 days or pupils.

Further to the above, children/staff with a temperature, should not return to work/school whilst they still have a temperature, but can return with mild cold symptoms and if they are otherwise well enough to be at work/school.

As we move into this phase we do still need to be cautious as we are aware that the number of COVID cases were increasing prior to the Easter Break.

There is no longer a legal requirement for us to specifically reference COVID control measures in risk assessment but as above, we are still strongly encouraging good ventilation, encouraging and enabling vaccination, frequent hand washing and robust cleaning routines etc. These are important measures to stop the spread of any potentially infectious disease.

We will review this stance into the new term and considering the latest guidance around reducing the spread of respiratory infections in the workplace. The NHS has updated new symptoms of COVID as below:

- a high temperature or shivering (chills) a high temperature means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste
- shortness of breath
- feeling tired or exhausted
- an aching body
- a headache
- a sore throat
- a blocked or runny nose
- loss of appetite
- diarrhoea
- feeling sick or being sick


Start and End of Day Routines - Reminder from last week

With the removal of restrictions and the introduction of new guidance our start and end of the day routines have now returned to pre-COVID timings.

Therefore from Wednesday 20th April the start and finish times for pupils will be as follows:

FS2: Start of Day 8.50am (doors open from 8.40am) End of Day 3.10pm

KS1: Start of Day 8.50am (doors open from 8.40am)



KS2: Start of Day 8.45am (doors open from 8.35am)

The gates will open at 8.30am on a morning to allow time to get onto site ready for doors opening at 8.35am (KS2) and close at 8.55am. Similarly the gates at the end of the day will open at 3.05pm ready for end of day at 3.10pm (KS1) and close at 3.30pm. If you do come onto the site early to collect your child please be courteous and stand away from the classroom windows and doors as pupils will still be learning until the end of the school day. Your support with this would be very much appreciated.

If we could also please ask that school equipment, including the gym equipment on the playgrounds, is not used at the beginning or end of the day. We appreciate that this is very tempting but use needs to be supervised by school adults so if you could please ensure your children do not use. This will ensure that pupils and families are able to stay safe.



Attendance

As we continue the return towards normality, attendance at school continues to be one of our key issues and as such continues to be closely monitored. Please remember if your child is unwell and unable to attend school, you should inform school by 9.30am that day in line with our school procedures. Please contact school on each day of absence unless otherwise agreed.

Also please remember that routine dental and medical appointments should not be made during school time. It is preferable and much more beneficial for pupils if appointments can be made either at the end of the school day or during school holidays. If you do have to make an appointment for during the school day, and we do appreciate that there are times when this may be necessary, please bring the appointment letter to the school office. Without this letter the absence will not be authorised.

Current Government regulations mean that absence from school can only be authorised for "exceptional circumstances" for which there is very clear established criteria, again set by the Government. It is therefore highly unlikely that time off school will be authorised during term time. Requests for term time absence must be made at least 10 days before the absence, except in emergencies, by booking a telephone appointment with a member of the Senior Leadership Team.

Should an appointment not be made, and in line with our safeguarding procedures and Government regulations, we will contact you with regards to your child's absence in order to clarify fully the reasons for absence. Your child's education is our primary focus and given the extensive research proving a direct link between good attendance and good outcomes, alongside the national attendance guidance for schools, we do follow all absences up. This is not about singling anybody out but simply carrying out our statutory duty as a school and as such I would ask for your support in communicating with us in a positive way. Thank you in anticipation of your continued support.



Safeguarding

Safeguarding is an important part of our work with children and young adults so we will keep this reminder in each edition of the Parish Post. Safeguarding is the responsibility of all of us. If you have concerns about the safety of any child, please let somebody know. Diane Mulley and Emily Hill are the designated safeguarding officers within the school. Similarly if you do require any support, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

School Uniform

As we head into the summer months, a reminder for parents/carers of expectations regarding school uniform. We are all very proud of our school uniform and as such, we would ask for the support of parents/carers in ensuring correct uniform is worn.

Our school uniform supplier is Nationwide School Uniforms and uniform can be ordered and paid for on-line; we do not hold any stock in school. The link to the website is below, you will then need to search for Spalding Parish to access the uniform.

If you order uniform by the third Monday of the month the uniform will be delivered to school in the last week of the month, free of charge. If you wish to have the uniform delivered to your home

address you can pay postage and it will be delivered shortly afterwards, or you can pick it up from the suppliers' shop in Spilsby.

Boys and Girls

Purple Sweatshirt or Cardigan Purple or White Polo Shirt Grey Trousers, Dress or Skirt Purple, Red or Yellow Gingham Summer Dress Plain Grey, Black or White Socks or Tights Flat Black Shoes - No trainers or heels No nail varnish Jewellery – only stud earrings or small objects of religious significance (these must be removed on PE days). No earrings or jewellery to be worn on PE days

Please support children to be independent when getting changed. Ensure they can recognise their name and items of clothing.

For the time being pupils are still asked to wear PE kit on their PE days (see below for details). We have maintained this to maximise learning time in this area. However, PE kit worn on these days should be in line with our PE kit expectations. Should this not be the case a member of staff will speak to you with regards to this.

Again, we would please ask that all parents/carers ensure pupils are wearing appropriate uniform colours and not anything other than those stated above. Please also ensure no logoed items as these are not in line with our uniform expectations and so should not be worn.

Curriculum Corner

Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 Statutory Assessments

As you may be aware end of Key Stage statutory assessments for Year 2 pupils (at the end of Key Stage 1) and Year 6 pupils (at the end of Key Stage 2) are undertaken in May. Key Stage 2 assessments will be undertaken in the week beginning 9th May with Key Stage 1 assessments undertaken throughout the month. Essentially these are assessments which are used to gauge the children's knowledge and understanding of the Key Stage 1 (for Year 2) and Key Stage 2 (for Year 6) curriculum.

A guide for parents/carers of pupils in Year 2 and Year 6 will be sent out later this week. This will give you further information re the assessments to be undertaken as well as how to support your child being prepared. Please be assured the assessments are nothing to be worried about as they will simply cover the curriculum taught in school. From a school's perspective, we know how brilliant all of the children are as we get to see this first hand on a daily basis. The assessments just give all of the children the opportunity to show this and we know they will do this brilliantly.






Key Stage 1
