## Bereavement of a Staff Member

It is with a very heavy heart that I am writing to inform you of the recent bereavement of Sarah Vaughan, one of our lunchtime supervisors in school. Pupils in school (Year 1 – Year 6) have also been informed of this very sad news today.

Sarah had been unwell in recent weeks and was being treated in hospital. Unfortunately, her condition deteriorated and she died in hospital at the weekend. Sarah was a very valued member of the school community as one of our much loved lunchtime supervisors. She was extremely popular with staff and pupils alike and loved her role in school, looking forward to coming to school each day. I myself consider myself very fortunate to know her and know this is also true for so many of the school community. We know she will be missed by everyone who knew her.

When someone dies, young people may experience many different feelings, such as sadness, anger or confusion. Some pupils may feel shocked and upset by the news, while others may be confused or numb. These reactions are all normal. We have tried to be open and honest but sensitive when speaking to the children and they have also been told that the adults in school will endeavour to answer any of their questions at school.
