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# Parish Post Phase Update #proudtobeparish

### EYFS:

We have had another very busy couple of weeks in EYFS including what we hope to be the first parent session of the academic year. The focus for this session was on Phonics with a session with Mrs Cooper, our Phonics Lead, in the hall followed by time seeing Phonics in action in the classrooms. It was fabulous to see so many parents come into school – thank you so much for your support with this - and I hope you will agree that the children were wonderful ambassadors for our Monster Phonics scheme. All of the children enjoyed showing the grown ups the different strategies that we use in school and sharing some phonics activities with them during independent learning time. As always, your

continued support is very much appreciated – we love having parents/carers in school and sharing the children's learning with you and will share details of our next workshop in due course. We also look forward to welcoming you into school in the coming weeks for our EYFS Christmas Presentation on 14<sup>th</sup> December.



### Year 2:

Year 2 have been continuing to explore the 'Polar Express' story in English. Last week as part of this work we came to school in our pyjamas and boarded the Polar Express train to the North Pole. We tried hot chocolate and watched a variety of clips from the film as a stimulus to support our writing. This included collecting useful vocabulary and all the vocabulary we have explored and collected will be used to help us write our description further on in the term.

Year 2 have also been on a walk outside to explore the environment. Part of this piece of work have involved grouping objects that have never been alive, that are alive and that are dead linking our Geography work to our Science. Later on in the term we are hopefully going to go on a local walk around Spalding to explore what places there are for to do such as entertainment and eating as part of our Geography work. We have also been doing lots of play rehearsals on stage and in the costumes ready for the performances next week. We have been practising using our loud and clear voices so all our adults can hear us. We are really excited to be able to share our performances with you all next week.

### Year 4:

Year 4 have been looking at multiplication and division in different ways, using the Build it, Draw it, Write it method to develop deeper understanding. They are also enjoying Times Table Tuesdays!

We have started reading 'Mary Poppins' as a class book, which is very entertaining. We also recently read many different texts about the Anglo-Saxons and how they lived, worshipped, governed and ruled. We have produced our own class book all about this in our English lessons!



The highlight of the last few weeks was our trip to The Collection at Lincoln Museum, where we had a whole day immersed in the history of the Anglo-Saxons. We were treated to a tour of the most interesting exhibits in the museum and then had a go at an archaeological dig

where we learned to record and report our finds before displaying them. We were fascinated by hearing about how they made their clothes and what they wore; we dressed up some of our class but got some of the items in the wrong places!



### Year 6:

Year 6 enjoyed meeting their Year 1 Reading Buddies, hearing them read, asking questions and then sharing a story with them. It was a fabulous session which was enjoyed by all. We cannot wait until next time.

On Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> November, Year 6 visited Debbie and her team at the Spalding Baptist Church to take part in 'Christmas Unwrapped.' It is great to be able to visit the Baptist Church as we always enjoy their Open the Book worships on a Tuesday at school. The children took part in decorating biscuits, which was a real favourite for all. There were some fantastic designs, which we hope made it home in one piece. We then moved through into the church where Debbie and the team led us through a variety of activities including: a short drama about Mary and Joseph being visited by Angel Gabriel; questions about traditions and the Christmas Story; a Christmas card jigsaw puzzle game; the story of the Shepherds and a Christmas Rap. Each game and activity was linked to representing God and why we celebrate Christmas.

In Maths, we are really enjoying exploring area of different shapes and using formula to calculate. This week we have moved onto volume and became collaborative experts when working with our learning partners to make a shape with a volume of 7 cubes. We listened carefully and without looking built our models following the instructions. Great skills were demonstrated by all!
