



# FS2:

This week we have been continuing to learn new sounds and blend these together to read. The children have amazed us with their progress and it is fabulous to see how many are reading at home every day.

We have also been continuing to extend our understanding of numbers, shapes and patterns. There have been so many achievements for all the children in these past couple of weeks and we are so proud of them all.



## Year 2:

Year 2 have been using the words we collected about dragons on our trip to Lincoln Castle to write some descriptions of dragons. Here is Albert's description:

The scary dragon has bright, long teeth and sharp, shiny claws. He has small, black eyes and cute, little wings. The huge dragon has stompy, little feet and protective, knobbly scales.

We have now received a postcard from the dragon from our Dragon Post book and are learning how to write a good postcard back to him.

### Year 4:

In Year 4 this week we have been reading Roald Dahl's 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' in English and Guided Reading. We have been looking at and deconstructing the character description of Willy Wonka, gathering some amazing vocabulary ideas in readiness for writing our own character descriptions next week of characters of our choosing. We have also begun to look at food chains in Science and are thinking like scientists to identify the producer, predator and prey within a food chain considering a variety of different habitats. We know that the producer is always plant based and that producers get their energy from the sun.

We have also looked at and compared the way that England is divided in modern day compared to Anglo – Saxon times and have identified what different endings to places mean, for example, -ton means farm and -ham means village. It was so interesting to find that some of the places still exist today such as Essex, East Anglia and Northumbria!

We are looking forward to another week full of amazing and interesting learning and where it will take us!

# Year 6:

On Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> October, Year 6 visited the Parish Church to attend a talk by local historian and expert Alastair Goodrum and received a tour with Revd. John. The children learnt about the Spalding B Company and their involvement in WW1. Our History question: 'What impact did World War 1 have on our local community?' was our focus and we enjoyed hearing about local men, where they lived in Spalding (some on the same streets as us), jobs they held prior to enlistment and the battles they fought in. Different children were also part of the talk, sharing details of key men and being part of an air battle linked to John Gleed. During the tour, the children visited St George's Chapel, a memorial to those who died in WWI, locating the names of men like Harry Goodrum, Cecil Adams and John Gleed. They also learnt about a stained glass window, commissioned by the Gleed family to honour their son and son-in-law who both lost their lives in the war. We also visited the former Drill Hall, on Haverfield Road, where soldiers were trained, finding the symbol of the Lincolnshire Regiment. Our last stop was Ayscoughfee, to take a moment of reflection at the War Memorial designed by the architect Sir Edwin Lutyens. We took time to pay our respect for the soldiers who gave their lives to fight for their country.
