## Parish Post Phase Update #proudtobeparish

## **EYFS:**

A huge welcome to all of our new pupils to school and their families – you are all very welcome additions to the Spalding family, we are pleased you are with us!

We are also really proud of all of our new starters and how they have settled during their first couple of weeks at Spalding Parish. Change can be really difficult and we are all very proud at how the children have adapted to their new environment during their relatively short time at SPCEDS.

We have all been very busy over these initial few weeks completing our baseline assessments of all the pupils. This will help inform our learning over the term and year ahead and ensure that this is very closely based on the children's prior knowledge and skills. We look forward to being able to share your child's achievements with you at our first Parent Consultation for EYFS parents/carers which will be held straight after the term break. We look forward to seeing you all there.

#### Year 2:

Year Two had an amazing trip to Lincoln Castle this week to help us answer our big question — 'Why did William the Conqueror build Lincoln Castle?' While we were there we met Lucy and Norman, the dragons, and have thought of words to describe them that will now help us in our dragon writing back at

school.

Whilst in Lincoln we went for a walk around the castle walls looking at whereabouts in Lincoln the castle was built. We had a great view of the cathedral from up there. We learned about the parts of a castle and what they would have been used for in the times of William the Conqueror.



#### Year 4:

Year 4 have started learning how to round numbers up and down. We have also looked at Roman Numerals and how they are used in everyday life. We have been reading "The Last Bear" and thinking about how to retrieve different types of information from a text. We are now experts at summarising a text and are putting our summaries together with predictions looking at what we have read, and then what might happen next. We are writing to inform this term and are writing a magazine article about flooding and climate change. The weather seems to have taken a topical turn, with us watching the rain pour down outside as we write about climate change and flood defences inside! In RE, we are thinking about celebrations and have also discussed Remembrance Sunday and designed a memorial. In Art we have learned to draw faces in proportion and are now learning how Picasso broke the rules and drew them in an abstract style. We have loved looking at the Sutton Hoo hoard in History and finding out about the Anglo-Saxons in Britain. In Science we have learned about teeth and conducted a fab experiment to see what happens when you leave eggs in different liquids for a week!

## Year 6:

What another fabulous week of learning in Year 6! In English, we have been writing stories linked to our study of Roald Dahl's book 'Boy', focusing in on the Great Mouse Plot. The children have blown us away with their planning and beautiful use of speech to advance the action in their side tickling stories. They have used the character of Mrs Prachett, the sweet shop owner, to develop their own malicious and revolting characters. Well done everyone! In Maths, we have started to look at the four operations starting with addition and subtraction. We have enjoyed exploring common factors and multiples completing investigations with hundred squares. Within Reading, we are using non-fiction texts to explore World War 1 and really building on our oracy skills to unpick a text by building on each other's ideas, asking questions and starting new lines of enquiry. These are skills we will extend across the curriculum. In Computing, we have explored IP addresses, developing understanding or protocols (rules) online and why we use Domain Name Servers. We had fun trying to remember IP addresses in groups of two, four and then six. In PE, we have been developing skills to play small team games using our netball skills.
