

## Parish Post Phase Update #proudtobeparish

### **Curriculum Focus:**

Term 2 has been a busy term so far for our budding Geographers, with plenty more learning still to come. Year 1 have been investigating where they live, taking a walk in the local community around Spalding and looking at various landmarks. Year 2 will be taking a trip into Spalding very soon to collect data on the types of businesses there are in the town so that they can inform others about what there is to do in Spalding. Year 3 received a special delivery to launch their learning this term - a box arrived in each classroom containing various items and the children had to work out which town they might be learning about from the given clues. Year 4 have been looking at the view out of their window and what they can to do improve it. Year 5 have thinking about how they can make a difference to their local area. They paid a visit to Arnold's Meadow and the riverbank and have been thinking about what they can do to support conservation and restoration. Year 6 have started to study the Spalding Flower Parade, thinking about why it is important and what difference it makes to the town and the economy. Steve Timewell, one of the current organisers, paid us a visit to share his experience and knowledge.

### Year 1:

We have been super busy in Year 1 this week! In Maths we are using number lines to subtract. We have also been using the number lines to help us write our subtraction number sentences.

We have had lots of fun in English this week, using adjectives to describe the setting of our

class story 'Lost and Found'. We used magic snow to feel and imagine what the snow in our setting may feel like and used the adjectives in our writing!

In Science we have furthered our knowledge on animal groups and their characteristics and have been using the animal figures in our class to group and classify based on their characteristics. We have also continued to rehearse for our Key Stage 1 Christmas Nativity and can't wait to share it with you all!

### Year 3:

In Year 3, we have been extremely busy these past few weeks. Firstly, we have been planning and performing our class presentations. It was lovely to see so many adults come along to support their child in their first KS2 class presentation. The pressure was on, but they all handled it superbly and impressed everyone in the audience! Speaking of performances, the Year 3 pupils are also getting ready for their first KS2 Carol Concert! As a result, they have been practising songs and we even braved the bad weather and headed to the church to get a real sense of the event on the 12<sup>th</sup> December.

Back to the school subjects and Year 3 have been delving deeper into multiplication and division, using manipulatives to create arrays to support understanding of sharing and grouping. We have also been busy in English, gathering resources for our museum and moving on to our next piece of writing using *The Wind in the Willows* as a stimulus for a character we invented last term. It has been a fantastic lead up to the end of term with still much more to enjoy including our first Year 3 trip to Flag Fen Peterborough on Friday and no doubt will have many stories to tell parents when they get home!

### Year 5:

This week in Design Technology, pupils in Year 5 have been designing bird hides following our recent trip to Arnold's Meadow. We looked at the function, materials, performance, and aesthetics of the design before making our prototypes. Next week we will begin making our hides using our design specifications.



In Science we have been learning about animal reproduction and life cycles to answer our big question



'How do animals reproduce?'. This week we have looked at the life cycles of mammals, birds, fish, and reptiles. We then worked in groups to create large life cycles of animals showing the stages of life and using a range of technical vocabulary to describe each stage in detail. Here are just some of the life cycles we created as part of this learning. We can't wait to find out more.
