Sports Update:

At the end of Term 3, a team of Year 6 pupils attended the Spalding Primary Schools Hockey Festival, hosted by Spalding Hockey Club. The festivals are held on a termly basis so this is the third one this academic year. For this event we were represented by a slightly changed squad with a number of our Year 5 players away on the trip to London to the British Museum but the whole team played absolutely brilliantly with some amazing results over the course of the event.

Year 1:

Year One have started the term super busy! We have started a number of new topics as we enter Term 4.

In Science we are continuing to learn about plants and what the parts of the plant do. We are even using our knowledge of plants to write our very own leaflets in English.

We have started our new Geography topic focussed on the four countries that make up the UK and we can now name some famous landmarks in London.

In RE we are furthering our learning from last term of the religion of Islam, we are really enjoying learning about Islam and can't wait to further our learning on this topic!

We are going to use our knowledge of forces to write a non-chronological report answering the question "How is magnetic force different to friction?".

In DT we will be designing, making and evaluating healthy sandwiches. We will be tasting different types of bread and choose our favourite to make a healthy and hopefully tasty sandwich.

Year 5:

Year 5 are excited to continue their learning during Term 4 after a fantastic Term 3. We all thoroughly enjoyed our trip to the British Museum in London, indeed all the children were a credit to the school throughout the visit and this was commented on by a number of museum staff and members of the public! We explored rooms containing Ancient Athenian and Spartan artefacts and studied information based on our History focussed enquiry question, 'How free were the people of Ancient Athens and Sparta?' After we had finished investigating these areas we then moved onto look at the Ancient Egyptian section for a quick explore in readiness for our topic in Term 5!

We are excited to move onto Geography this term where our focus will be on Europe and what makes it wonderful!
