# Parental Engagement – Parent Workshops:

What a successful Autumn term we have had! We have now held four workshops, two focussing on Early Reading/Story Sharing and two were exploring different ways to learn through play. All of the sessions held have welcomed families into school to spend quality time with their children. We have laughed, chatted, drank hot chocolate and eaten more biscuits than we would dare to admit, which has been amazing to be part of. It has been great to see families engaging with other families, supporting each other and offering each other advice. The workshops are made up of two parts. Part one is time for parents and Charlotte Hardy, our SENCo, to talk about the focus of the workshop. Part two is where the children join the workshop, which is of course the most exciting part!

#### **Story Sharers**

This was a wonderful workshop. Families spent time sharing story sacks full of books, puppets, wooden spoon characters and images to sequence. The children loved having their parents in school and demonstrating their reading skills. Our curriculum has a huge focus on reading, oracy and vocabulary, so we discussed with parents the importance of developing early reading skills. Many parents shared top-tips with other parents of how they promote reading at home **Learning Through Play** 

This workshop brought childhood memories of Christmas back for the parents. We shared fond times where we sat round the table with our own parents and other family members at Christmas sharing a board game. We discussed that these times seem to have been replaced with fancier games, toys and technology. Although we recognise times are changing and we are evolving into a technology-led world, it was amazing to dip back into classic games such as Snakes and Ladders, Tumbling Monkeys, Connect Four and Bingo! Parents were amazed at how many learning opportunities can come from these simple games, such as: turn taking, listening skills, number recognition and prepositional language.
