

On Friday 2nd February I joined Year 5 on their trip to the British Museum in London which supported their learning in History about the Ancient Greek civilisation. The children had a worksheet to fill in with their findings about how different people were treated and about the interesting objects they found in the museum.

The children absolutely loved exploring, reading about the pieces on display and looking at the statues and unusual objects such as pottery, coins and jewellery. The sheer joy and love of learning was clear to see, they even got to practice their maths skills in the shop!

I asked the children what they enjoyed the most from their trip.

'I loved seeing the glass bowls, they were very unique and pretty.'

'I really liked the big horse statue, it was so tall.'

'I loved being in London and seeing what we have been learning about.'

I must end by congratulating Year 5 on their outstanding behaviour throughout the day, they truly made me 'Proud to be Parish'.

Year 2:

In Year 2 we have been creating some beautiful landscapes. First we learned to add texture to our art using hatching, cross hatching and stippling. Then we were introduced to water colour paints. We tried using these to mix ifferent shades of colours and looked at how if you layer them up, they make brighter and darker colours.

We looked at some pictures of tulip fields around Spalding in the 1950s, linking to our History learning this term and were surprised to hear that people used to travel for miles to drive round and look at them growing.

We used these pictures as inspiration to create our own tulip field landscapes and are very proud of

our pieces of art.







Year 4:



Back in October, Year 4 wrote reports about flooding and how we can reduce the effects. Mrs Slade sent a selection of Year 4's work to David Attenborough, so that he could see what we had researched and read our ideas about how to help the world in the future. To our great excitement, we had a handwritten reply from David Attenborough! He congratulated everyone on the reports they had written; he was most impressed with their work!

We have just begun writing an epilogue to The Great Food Bank Heist by Onjali Raouf. We found the story really exciting and are thinking up some fantastically imaginative ways that it might continue. We can't wait to share them with the author; we are hoping for another personal reply!

On that note, we also wrote to our local District Councillors recently, to tell them about our Geography project, which was all about improving our locality. We are hoping to have some exciting news on that front very soon!

Year 6:

What a term this has been! Year 6 have managed to fit so much exciting learning in and have made us so proud with their positive and curious attitudes. Number Day saw us exploring the book 'Infinity and Me' and undertaking a number of learning opportunities to talk about their understanding, create our own infinity symbols and describe how they would imagine infinity. Great discussions were had!

In PE, we have been exploring mirroring and balancing in gymnastics. Creating sequences with a partner, from floor work to the mats and then using all equipment. Pairs were able to show a range of sequences they created developing jumps, balances and rolls. We were very impressed with their application of these to incorporate the equipment. Some children were able to show greater depth skills when vaulting – showing great take off, flight and landing. Watch out the Olympics in a few years to come.

Mental Health Week has enabled us to work on building a positivity journal. We have celebrated ourselves, what we are thankful for, proud moments, different emotions linked to our regulation stations and a daily reflection each day. We also watched a brilliant story of a man who through his work with the railway wanted to make London smile. The children have created their own quotes of the day, which have been very powerful to embrace positivity in our daily lives.
