Dear Parent/Carer,

Car Parking

Please remember to park courteously for the safety of all our community whilst respecting our neighbours. Please park legally allowing the safe use of the road and pavements for all. Do not park on the public footpath as it makes it dangerous with the numbers of people using them.

If you are just dropping your child off, please park up and ensure their safe exit from the vehicle on to the pavement so they can then walk safely into school. The closer to school you get the more congested it is so if you are able to park further away, or even walk all the way to and from school, please do so.

Change of Weather

The weather is turning ever colder now (and wetter) as we now firmly experience the coldness of winter. We are still having instances of children coming into school without a suitable coat or appropriate PE kit for outdoor PE. Please could we ask that, as we enter Term 3, you ensure that your child has these warmer items so they can participate in all school activities.

EYFS Parent Consultations

Firstly I would like to take this opportunity to once again welcome you to the Spalding Parish family. As you will no doubt be aware, even in the short period you have been part of our school community, ensuring the children are happy and supporting their needs is high priority for all at SPCEDS. This includes ensuring that pupils have been supported throughout their transition to primary school. We recognise the part you play as parents/carers in knowing your child and their needs and as such would like to invite you in for an extended parent consultation meeting to discuss how they have settled at school and also about their achievements so far this academic year. This will also allow you the opportunity to contribute further to your child's education as we continue to build the relationship between home and school.

These meetings will take place during the week beginning **13**th **January 2025.** There will be an allocated 15 minute time slot for these meetings over the course of the day.

Illness

Should your child be unwell and be suffering from symptoms of sickness and diarrhoea please do not send them back to school until 48 hours after their last bout. Any sickness or diarrhoea should be dealt with in this way following the guidance from the NHS and will ensure the spreading of these conditions is reduced. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Spalding Parish Site

As you will know ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all when of the school site is high priority for us all and something that we really hope that all stakeholders will support. Recently we have had a number of concerns raised about some of the language used on site. Please be aware, in line with our Adult Code of Conduct, that swearing and inappropriate language is not to be used either on the school site or when waiting to access the school site. This could leave to a ban from the school site so if we could ask all adults to reflect on and ensure that their behaviour and language is appropriate for even the youngest of ears. Thank you!

Also a reminder that the school site is a dog free site – this includes all dogs whether they are walking or being carried (the only exception being guide dogs). We know that both adults and children can be scared and intimidated by dogs and not always know how to react to them. We feel it is important that the school site is a safe place for all children and would welcome your cooperation with this matter. You will be asked to leave the site if you do bring a dog onto the school site.

Starting School in September 2025?

Applications for a place for any child due to start school in September 2025 are now open via the Lincolnshire County Council website. You can apply by clicking the following link - <u>Click Here</u>. Applications can be made between 15th November 2024 to 15th January 2025. If you already have a child in school, you still need to register their sibling in this way as although you will be allocated a place in line with the admissions criteria, their application must go through the official channels.

We are aware that choosing a school for your child is one of the biggest decisions that you can make as a parent and we want to ensure that every answer to a question/query is given and every opportunity to explore the school is exercised. Should you still wish to visit, there is plenty of time before the application round closes and we ask that you contact the school office to make an appointment.

Start and End of Day Routines

A huge thank you to all of our parent body for ensuring their children are in school on time and ready to learn following recent pleas, it is very much appreciated. If I could just ask that, at both the start and end of day, you supervise your children before dropping off and after collecting. Whilst there are staff around at these times, they do have a class responsibility and will be very focussed on welcoming children at the start of the day and ensuring all pupils are handed over to parents at the end of the day.

If I could also ask you to keep all children, including school age and pre-school children, off the school equipment at the beginning at the end of the school day. Such equipment has restrictions in terms of numbers of children and weight and as such use should be supervised. As a school we feel it is very important to provide resources for the children to use within school and have worked hard to fundraise in order to be able to finance such resources. However such items are very expensive and do therefore need to be respected and looked after to ensure longevity. Thank you for your support in this matter.



Uniform

We look forward to welcoming the pupils back to school, looking smart in their uniforms. If you could please ensure that children are wearing appropriate uniform, including white or purple polo shirts, white or purple sweatshirt or cardigan, grey trousers or skirt and black school shoes.

Our policy for pupils to wear PE kit for identified PE days remains. This does need to be school PE kit as per policy. Please ensure pupils are not wearing earrings on PE days. This does allow us to really make the most of learning time however it is important that this is not abused or this may need to be reviewed. **Please ensure PE kit is only worn on PE days – trainers for example should not be worn on other days.**
