Dear Parent/Carer,

Start of Term 1 – A Very Warm Welcome Back!

I hope that you and your loved ones have kept safe and well over the summer holidays and you have been able to make the most of the break to spend time with family and friends.



It has been fantastic to have the children back in school this week – we were very excited to be able to welcome them back on Wednesday. I must also commend the children on their fantastic attitudes to learning following their return to school this week. We were all together in Collective Worship earlier this week when all of the children were absolutely amazing – including their singing. I have also visited classrooms over the course of the week and have been absolutely amazed at just how well the pupils have settled back into the routine of school, faced with new classrooms and in most cases new adults. We look forward to this continuing over the year ahead.

Civil Unrest

Over the summer we saw some horrendous acts of violence and riots across the country which deeply troubled us. Our aim is to provide an inclusive environment where all are welcomed, loved and given the opportunity to flourish. As a school we want to see the flourishing of all and we want to empower all in our school family to love one another other with humility, justice and kindness. What we have seen in the nation does not represent us, we state there is no room for racism or division, no room for violence or treating people differently because of their race or religion. We recognise that we may have families that have been affected by what has happened and as we return to school we would like to offer our support. Summer Update

School may have been closed for the summer break however work on the school building and infrastructure has continued. The whole school has been repainted externally and we have also had a number of doors replaced alongside other works undertaken in school. We have also had a move around internally of some of the offices, also ensuring we have more resource rooms for pupils to work. Ensuring that school is a welcoming and pleasant place to be is important to us and obviously the facilities we



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provide is one element of this.

Keeping Us Informed

There have obviously been a number of changes in school since we finished in July and know that there are likely to be changes within families too.

If anything has changed, you've moved house, changed your mobile number, your child has been diagnosed with a condition or an allergy etc., please let us know as soon as possible so that we can ensure the information we hold for your child is current and up to date. We have carried over permission for walking to and from school from the previous academic year (2023-24), however if this has changed, please get in touch – we recognise that this will primarily be our older pupils in school in line with safeguarding.

Good communication is obviously key within any relationship. We will endeavour to keep you informed of things happening in school in a timely manner and we would just ask the same of you as parents/carers. We know that often things can happen at home which can impact your child and it is always useful to keep us in the loop where possible so we can support your child where appropriate.

Website

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Key dates for the year ahead, including term dates for the academic year, can be found at the back of this letter so you can refer to these over the course of the academic year. Further dates will also be added as we finalise details for trips and visits, sports events etc. and each term an updated date list will be sent home to parents/carers via a termly newsletter. Key dates will also appear in the weekly Parish Post for each short term. Letters re Class Presentations will be sent home within the next few days.

Curriculum

We also know that parents/carers are keen to know what their child will be learning over the course of each term. All school staff are excited for the new school year and supporting your child's transition into new Phases, new Year Groups and new classes and being part of your child's learning. During their time at SPCEDS we aim to prepare them to be courageous citizens in an ever-changing world, developing vital skills in both their current learning and their subsequent adventures.

The overarching question for the whole curriculum focuses on 'How do we make a difference?' with the rest of the curriculum linked to this primary question. Again this information can be found on the website via the Learning tab, however a brief overview of the curriculum for each Year Group can be found below. There are also lots of exciting learning opportunities planned for the term ahead.

EYFS

The EYFS curriculum will evolve based on the children's interests and closely linked to the EYFS curriculum. Further details will follow in the next couple of weeks once all the children are settled in school.

Year 1

Welcome to Year 1 from Miss Bacchus and Miss Turner. This term we are settling into Year One by accessing the curriculum through continuous provision and small group work.

The curriculum in Term 1 looks at each child individually by creating a poem titled 'All About Me' we will use the sounds we have learnt in Phonics. In Art we will be creating self-portraits by looking at the work of Frida Kahlo and learning how to draw the features of a face using different pressures of the pencil. In Science we are learning to identify the different animal groups, including humans. We're expanding on our knowledge in Maths and looking at place value within 10, we will be using lots of different manipulatives to support our learning. In History we focus on the work of Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale. We're very excited to start our Year 1 learning journey.

Year 2

The Year 2 team – Miss Hearth and Mr Robinson - are all very excited about the term ahead and the planned curriculum linked to our overarching question 'How can we make a difference?' We are looking forward to learning more about castles as the focus of our learning in Term 1. In History our big question is 'Why did William the Conqueror build Lincoln Castle?' We are excited to be going on our first school trip to visit the castle to enhance our learning. In English we are writing to inform. We are starting with letters to our table monitors so that they get to know us well. We will then go on to write some character descriptions using the book James and the Giant Peach as a stimulus.

In Science we will be looking at animals and finding out what they need to survive and grow healthily. In Art, we look at the art work of Andy Warhol and use this as a stimulus to make our own self portraits. We are looking forward to an exciting term of learning.

Year 3

Welcome to Year 3 – Miss Robinson, Mr Stanshall and Mrs Durno are very much looking forward to the



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year ahead. During Term 1 in Year 3, we will start to learn French for the first time which we are really excited about. In Science, we will be learning about the human body focusing on the skeleton and how it helps and protects our bodies.

In RE we are going to be learning about salvation and why we call Good Friday Good Friday. In History we will be exploring the Stone Age to Iron Age and hope to visit Flag Fen to learn more about this. In English, we will begin by writing letters to introduce ourselves to Miss Robinson (LKS2 Phase Lead) and will be followed by us planning and writing character descriptions about a character in Roald Dahl's *George's Marvellous Medicine*. In Maths we continue to develop and build on our knowledge of number and place value.

Year 4

A very warm welcome to Year 4 from Mrs Slade, Mrs Hirst and Miss Basduvar! This term in History we will be learning about the Anglo-Saxon era, whilst in RE the children will study celebrations across different religions. In English we are writing letters to Mrs Hill to apply to be a table monitor at lunch. We will then plan and write character descriptions using Roald Dahl's *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*.

In Art we will look at Portraiture; particularly the portraits of Pablo Picasso. In Science we are delving into the question, 'Why is digestion important?'. Within this we will carry out various experiments and look at what happens to food once it has entered our body. In Maths we will continue to develop and build on our understanding on the number system extending this to tenths and hundredths.

Year 5

Miss Wakefield, Miss Jina and Miss Arnold are excited for the new school year and supporting your child's transition into Upper Key Stage 2 and Year 5. There are lots of exciting learning opportunities planned for the term ahead. The overarching question for the whole curriculum focuses on 'How do we make a difference?' The children will be writing to inform and developing skills through sentence development and features used in non-fiction writing. Hands on Maths, exploring place value and addition and subtraction will enable the children to build, draw, write and develop their reasoning skills.

Through Science, the children will explore how they can use science to make sense of the world around them. Developing an understanding of how humans change as they get older. In an ever-changing world of technology, Year 5 will develop an understanding of how we use it to share information – with a big focus on using it safely. The children will explore the Battle of Hastings 1066 and why it was such an important conquest in British History. Watch out for a re-enactment on the mound at the bottom of the field! 'How does life offer opportunities for good?' is the question for RE this term with the focus on the resurrection for Christians.

Portraits will be the objective for the whole school in Art, with Year 5 developing conversations about what they see and draw. In Music, performing and listening is the focus as the children building on their skills from Year 3 in recorders. Working as a team, the children will build their hockey skills. Hopefully some will strive to join the school hockey team. Throughout the whole curriculum each question has been built on 'why this' and 'why now' to make their learning journey valuable and link through their learning in other year groups. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to speak to a member of the Year 5 team.

Year 6

Welcome to Year 6 and your child's final step in their learning journey with us at Spalding Parish C of E



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Day School. Miss Weatherhill, Miss Siddall and Miss Bird feel very lucky to be a part of your child's learning and preparing them to be courageous citizens in an ever-changing world by developing skills which are a vital toolkit in their current learning and then on into their next exciting adventures. The overarching question for the whole curriculum focuses on 'How do we make a difference?' Year 6 will explore this throughout all curriculum areas.

In Maths, we will use manipulatives to build confidence in place value and the four operations. Using oracy as a platform to build on each other's ideas, challenge and dig deeper. Writing to inform will support us to write a number of non-fiction pieces including an autobiography based on Roald Dahl's book 'Boy'. Reading will be key to developing vocabulary and embracing a love of books through the Year 6 Reading Spine. We are excited to apply for our Blue Peter badges linked through a reading challenge.

Building from their learning in Computing, they will explore how we use technology to communicate and understand the positives of technology as well as keeping safe. In Science, we will explore the role of the heart and how to keep it healthy – including investigations linked through PE. 'How can our knowledge of the past support our understanding of the present and shape the future?' will focus our History skills to develop an understanding of the impact World War 1 had on our local community. A visit to the Parish Church of St Mary and St Nicolas, including the War Memorial and a talk by an expert Historian will support the children in answering the question. In RE, we will think about what we believe, how we live and how that can make a difference to the world. With a particular spotlight on 'What does it mean if God is loving and holy?'

Building on skills throughout school, Year 6 will use the grid method in Art to create a self-portrait. In Music, performing and listening is the focus as the children building on their skills from Year 5 in recorders. Working as a team, the children will build their netball skills. Hopefully some will strive to join the school netball team. In Year 6, we strive to build on, deepen and develop the important prior learning your child has received at SPCEDS. We strive to make learning fun and hands on, learning that has real-life purposes. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to speak to a member of the Year 6 team.

Throughout the whole curriculum each question has been built on 'why this' and 'why now' to make their learning journey valuable and link through their learning in other year groups. Your child will be sent home with a Reading Spine to support and develop their reading diet. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to speak to a member of the relevant Year Group team.

Parental Engagement

As you will know our relationship with parents is very important and we look forward to continuing building these strong relationships over the course of the 2024-25 academic year. Over the course of the year we look forward to welcoming parents and carers into school for Class Presentations, curriculum days, parent workshops, sports days and celebration events. We hope to be able to share with you in the coming weeks our plan for parent workshops this academic year. We would also like to take this opportunity to share with you a coffee morning being held on 10th October at 2pm by the Lincolnshire Parent Carer Forum as part of our participation in the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) programme – see attached flier. We look forward to seeing you there. We would also like to also share the dates for our open mornings for families of pupils due to start school in September 2025. This is an opportunity for parents considering SPCEDS as their child's school



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to come and visit and see our EYFS provision in action. You are very welcome to come along and see what our provision looks like, even if you do have children in school already. Alternatively you could always share these dates with family and friends – see attached flier. We look forward to seeing you there.

Start and End of Day Routines – Reminder

Thank you for your support in ensuring pupils are at school on time, it is very much appreciated and does ensure pupils are ready for the start of the day.

FS2: Start of Day 8.50am (doors open from 8.40am) End of Day 3.10pm
For FS2 this will apply from Friday 6th September

KS1 (Year 1 - 2): Start of Day 8.50am (doors open from 8.40am) End of Day 3.10pm

KS2 (Year 3 - 6): Start of Day 8.45am (doors open from 8.35am) End of Day 3.20pm

In a morning the gates will open at 8.30am, allowing time to get onto site ready for doors opening at 8.35am (KS2) and 8.40am (FS2/KS1), and close at 8.55am. In an afternoon the site will open at 3.05pm and close at 3.30pm. If we could please ask that children are in school ready for the start of the school day so they do not miss any key learning.

Parish Pioneers

Parish Pioneers, as the majority of you will know, is our before and after school provision. This operates from 7.30am each morning till the start of the school day and from 3.10pm in an afternoon till 5.45pm.

Uniform

We look forward to welcoming the pupils back to school, looking extremely smart in their uniforms (see attached sheet for details). If you could please ensure that children are wearing appropriate uniform, including white or purple polo shirts, purple sweatshirt or cardigan, grey trousers or skirt and black school shoes. School summer dresses can also be worn as can grey pinafores.

Our policy for pupils to wear PE kit for identified PE days remains. This does need to be school PE kit as per school policy. Please ensure pupils are not wearing earrings on PE days. This does allow us to really make the most of learning time however it is important that this is not abused or this may need to be reviewed.

Please ensure PE kit is only worn on PE days – trainers for example should not be worn on other days. Teachers in school are currently just finalising their timetables and as such PE days will be confirmed by Year Groups this week. Year Groups will also display a poster of this information in their classroom windows so please look out for this.

Please do make sure uniform is named as this will mean it can be easily returned if mislaid. If you do have any queries regarding uniform, please get in touch. All of the children have been provided with a named school water bottle and these should be used for school.

Attendance

We cannot stress enough the importance of excellent attendance alongside punctuality as it can impact



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so much on the achievement and progress over the course of a school year. If a child is late into school they may miss key teaching at the start of lessons which can also unsettle them for the rest of the day. Where attendance levels are a concern this can also influence the progress children make.

We will continue to monitor attendance rigorously over the course of the school year and ask for your support in ensuring pupils attend regularly and on time. This will ensure that they do not miss any vital learning and supports your child in ensuring they reach their potential.

And Finally...

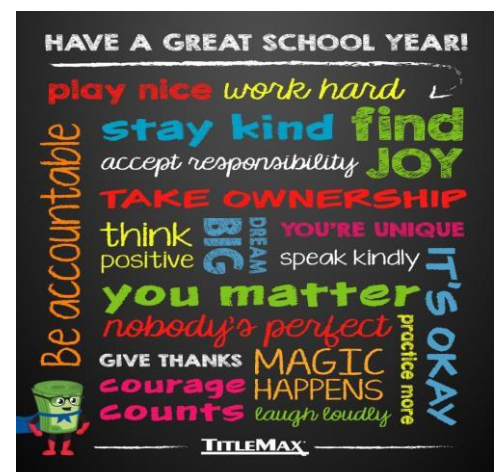
