Let's Celebrate - Year 3:

This term in Year 3 we have been learning some very exciting things. In History, we have been learning about Prehistoric Britain and how Britain has changed from the Stone Age to today. We have also gone on a journey through the Bronze Age and Iron Age to help us understand how much Britain changed even within prehistoric times. We have also been on our first Year 3 trip to Flag Fen Archaeology Park, where we had amazing day completing lots of fabulous learning activities. These included making Stone Age clay pots, becoming archaeologists exploring artefacts, exploring prehistoric ruins and having a story in a replica Bronze Age roundhouse.

In Science we have been learning about the human body, learning scientific names for bones such as the skull, spine, ribcage and femur. We have also learned about muscles and how they help us move, as well as how tendons keep our muscles attached to our bones. In R.E. we have been exploring the religion of Sikhi, their beliefs and how they live their lives through these beliefs. We know that duty is extremely important to Sikhs and we have been thinking about our own duties and how we can make sure they are done voluntary. We are looking forward to even more exciting Year 3 learning this term and beyond!

Curriculum Focus - Phonics

As you will know, learning to read is the most important thing your child will learn at our school. Everything else depends on it, so we put as much energy as we possibly can into making sure that every single child learns to read as quickly as possible. We want your child to love reading – and to want to read for themselves. This is why we put our efforts into making sure they develop a love of books as well as simply learning to read. This year we have moved to a new phonics programme. Read Write Inc. (RWI) is a comprehensive, systematic synthetic phonics programme designed to create confident, fluent readers and writers. It focuses on teaching children to decode (read) and encode (spell) words by understanding the relationship between sounds and letters. This approach ensures rapid progress in these core literacy skills. Despite only introducing this in September we are all very pleased at how successfully this has been implemented across the whole school and so proud at how hard the children have been working and the progress they have already made. We know that parents are also keen to support reading and would therefore like to invite you to our **Phonics Workshop on Thursday 23rd October at 2.30pm** – we hope to see you there.

Beyond the Curriculum - Visits & Visitors, Parents & Pastoral, Clubs & Competitions:

As you may be aware we work really closely with our local secondary schools, developing links which in turn supports transition from Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 3. As part of this work we have recently developed links with the languages department at Spalding Academy and, as part of this link, our Year 5 cohort have been invited to Spalding Academy to participate in some languages workshops.

Earlier this week, one of our Year 5 classes (Y5SS) took part in an exciting languages workshop at Spalding Academy. Through a variety of games and activities, the children proudly showcased their French learning by introducing themselves, expressing emotions, and using vocabulary related to numbers and classroom items such as pens and books.

Y5SS were fantastic ambassadors for Spalding Parish throughout the visit. The language teachers were thoroughly impressed with their confidence and level of French skills. The class even experienced a fire drill while on site and responded calmly and sensibly, listening carefully to all instructions.

Further workshops are planned over the course of the year with our other Year 5 classes —watch this space for more updates!
